YEAR 1/2T



PARKING AROUND SCHOOL ZONES

Just a reminder to all parents and caregivers to ensure notice is taken of all parking signs. The most update parking rules state that around pedestrian crossings you cannot stop within 20 metres before a pedestrian crossing or 10 metres after a pedestrian crossing unless there is a control sign permitting parking. Failure to adhere to this rule may result in a maximum penalty: \$439 and two demerit points. Our pedestrian crossing is located outside the school hall on Dobell Drive. Lake Macquarie council rangers and police regularly supervise all local schools to ensure safety around crossings is maintained. We encourage parents to park along Puna and Beach Roads, helping to minimise the traffic on an already busy Dobell Drive.



ROAD RULES IN SCHOOL ZONES:

Pedestrian crossings

You cannot stop within 20 metres before a pedestrian crossing or 10 metres after a pedestrian crossing unless there is a control sign permitting parking. Mavinum pencher £42 and two demarks points

Double parking

You may not stop on the road alongside to another vehicle at any time even to drop off or pick up passengers. Moximum penalty: \$330 and two demerit points

Parking on a verge

You cannot stop or park on a verge area (footpath, nature strip, dividing strip or kerb).
