School programs and Staff update

Next term we have some very exciting programs commencing at WWPS. Each Monday we will have the expertise of a Speech Therapist in our Kindergarten and Year 1 classrooms. Ms Ashley Pippen will be working with students in K pink, K/1 red and 1/2 orange. This is very exciting news for our school and we are looking forward to the added benefits for students who are part of the program.

We also have a Student Wellbeing Officer joining our team next term. Olivia Dominish is a qualified Social Worker who has been engaged by our school through CALM. Olivia's role will be to provide wellbeing support for students K-6. This may include one on one or small group sessions that focus on particular skills or strategies such as dealing with anxiety, being a good friend, overcoming loss, understanding and expressing emotion. Students may be referred to programs by our Learning Support Team, which includes our school counsellor, Lauren Cohen. From day 1 next term we will also have a final year Bachelor of Teaching practicum student from the University of Newcastle, Miss Kara Lees. Kara will be working alongside Mrs Russell in 1/2 orange for her 10 week practicum. Make her feel welcome and say g'day! Kara is very excited to be joining our team.

Positive Parenting Program – Triple P

I am proud to announce that we are hosting the Triple P parenting program at our school next term. The program is aimed at parents of 2 – 12 year olds and its aim is to assist parents with strategies to develop positive relationships with their child and encourage better behaviour. Being a parent is the most difficult yet most rewarding job in the world and all parents experience challenges with their children. This program runs for 4 consecutive weeks for two hours per session. Each session will be from 9:40 to 11:40 in our SPR (old hall).
